1. Definition: pray (v)

4336 προσεύχομαι proseuchomai

- = to offer prayers, to pray to God
- = to speak to God, to ask God for

Webster Dictionary

- to address supplication to a divinity, especially to the true God
- the offering of adoration, confession, supplication and thanksgiving to the Supreme Being
- 2. What is the purpose of prayer?
 - a) (A)DORATION and praise
 - our God is worthy of praise
 - He is greatly to be praised
 (Ps 18:3; Ps 145:3; 1 Chr 29:10-13)

b) CONFESSION

- mercy and forgiveness are ours when we confess our sins to God
- confession is with the mouth (spoken) (Ps 32:5; 1 Jn 1:9; Lk 18:10-14; Ps 51:1-9)

c) THANKSGIVING

- many encouragements to pray also call for the expressing of thanks to God
- praying in everything with thanksgiving is the antidote to anxiety

(Eph 5:20; Col 4:2; 1 Thess 5:17-18; Heb 13:15; Phil 4:6)

d) SUPPLICATION

- we are commanded to let our requests be made known to God
- we are encouraged to make supplications for all men

(Phil 4:6; 1 Tim 2:1-2; 1 Ki 8:28-29)

- one way to remember the purpose of prayer is with the simple acronym ACTS
- 3. Why should we pray?
 - we are commanded to pray
 - always without losing heart
 - unceasingly
 - in everything, in all circumstances
 - for all people, for all the saints (Lk 18:1; 1 Thes 5:17; Phil 4:6; 1 Ti 2:1; Eph 6:18-19)
- 4. To whom are we to pray?
 - pray to God, the Sovereign Lord
 - → the Father
 - → the Lord Jesus
 - → there is no prayer recorded in Scripture that is directed to the Holy Spirit

(Acts 4:24; Mt 6:9; Ac 7:59; 2 Co 12:8-9; 1 Co 1:2)

- we have access to the Father through
 Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit (Eph 2:18)
- in Christ, our great high priest forever, we have boldness and confidence to draw near to the throne of grace (Heb 2:17; 4:14-16; 6:20)

- the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness
 - we don't know how to pray as we ought
 - He intercedes for us according to the will of God
 - He makes our weak prayers effective
 (Ro 8:26-27)
- 5. The duty of prayer is also a magnificent and precious privilege for
 - the righteous God's ears are open to them
 - only the saved are the righteous (Pro 15:8; 1 Pe 3:12; 2 Co 5:21; 1 Co 1:30)
- 6. Please note: God does not listen to or answer every prayer. He will not answer those who:
 - a) do not pay attention to His Word
 (Pro 28:9; Zech 7:11-13)
 - b) remain in their sin, and regard iniquity in their hearts

(Isa 59:1-2; Jn 9:31; Ps 66:18; Pro 1:24-25, 28)

- c) forsake God and worship other gods/idols (Jer 11:11-14; 14:10-12; Eze 8:15-18)
- d) do not treat others justly

(Pro 21:13; Isa 1:15; Micah 3:2-4)

e) pray without faith

(James 1:6-7)
