Christ DIED for our sins ... the EVENT (Part 1)

- On the road to Jerusalem, Jesus foretells His betrayal, mistreatment, death and His resurrection in three days (Mt. 20:17-19; Mk. 10:32-34)
- 2. FRIDAY / SATURDAY Jesus arrives in Bethany and stays with Mary, Martha and Lazarus (Jn 12:1)
- 3. SATURDAY = Sabbath day of rest
 - at supper, Mary anoints Jesus with a very costly perfume
 - Judas is upset at the waste of it
 - Jesus says it is for His burial
 - many Jews believe in Jesus because of Lazarus
 - the chief priests plot to kill Lazarus (Jn 12:1-11)
- **4. SUNDAY** The Triumphal Entry
 - disciples get the donkey from Bethpage
 - Jesus rides over the Mt of Olives, crosses the Kidron Valley into Jerusalem
 - the crowd welcomes Him with Hosannas as the King of Israel
 - Jesus weeps over Jerusalem and predicts her destruction
 - He briefly goes to the Temple
 - He returns to Bethany for the night (Mt 21:1-17; Mk 11:1-11; Lk 19:28-44: Jn 12:12-19)
- **5. MONDAY** Jesus returns to the Temple
 - on the way Jesus curses a fig tree
 - at the Temple He drives out all the sellers and money changers
 - He heals the blind and the lame who came to Him at the Temple
 - He teaches throughout the day
 - some Greeks come to see Jesus
 - the crowd is astonished
 - leaders seek to destroy Him they are afraid of Him
 - Jesus spends the night in Bethany (Mt 21:10-19; Mk 11:12-19; Lk 19:45-48; Jn 12:20-36)

- TUESDAY Jesus and the disciples set out for Jerusalem
 - the cursed tree has withered
 - at the Temple the priests question Jesus' authority to clear out the Temple courts
 - Jesus teaches by parables:
 - the two sons
 - the vinedressers
 - the wedding banquet
 - Pharisees, Sadducees and Herodians try to trap Jesus:
 - with taxes to Caesar issues
 - concerning the resurrection
 - concerning commandments
 - Jesus asks them how David's son can be his Lord
 - He pronounces woes against the scribes and Pharisees for their hypocrisy
 - Jesus laments over Jerusalem
 - the widow gives her 2 mites
 - leaving the Temple the disciples point out the beautiful stones
 - Jesus says the Temple will be destroyed
 - on the Mt of Olives He teaches His disciples more about the destruction, His return and the time of the end
 - parable of the ten virgins
 - parable of the talents
 - the sheep and the goats
 - Jesus reminds the disciples about His coming crucifixion
 - in Bethany at dinner at Simon the leper's house Jesus is again anointed with costly perfume – for His burial (Mt 21:19-26:13; Mk 11:20-14:11; Lk 20:1-21:36)

7. WEDNESDAY -

- probably a quiet day in Bethany for Jesus
- chief priests and elders discuss a way to kill Jesus
- Judas goes to the chief priests and agrees to betray Jesus (Mt 26:1-16; Mk 14:1- 11; Lk 22:3-6)

8. THURSDAY - Passover

- the disciples locate the house to celebrate the Passover and they make the preparations
- Jesus celebrates the Passover with His disciples
 - He washes the disciples' feet
 - Judas is identified as the betrayer
 - they argue over who is the greatest
 - Judas leaves
 - Peter's denial is predicted
 - Jesus institutes the Lord's Supper
 - He speaks to them about:
 - His leaving them and going to the Father
 - the vine and the branches
 - opposition and persecution from the world
 - the coming Holy Spirit
 - joy coming at His resurrection
 - the promise of answered prayer
- Jesus prays for all His disciples
- they sing a hymn and leave the upper room for the garden of Gethsemane on the Mt of Olives
- Jesus speaks three agonizing prayers of submission to His Father's will (Mt 26:17-46; Mk 14:12-42; Lk 22:7-46; Jn 13:1-18:1)
