THE CHURCH OF SO GREAT A SALVATION – Pt 2 Week 6 – **History Pt. 3**

- 1. During and toward the end of the "Dark Ages"
 - a) papal religious authority was complete
 - b) it wielded significant political power as well as often resorting to military warfare
 - c) the masses were totally ignorant of the Bible
 - d) the invention of the printing press would powerfully change things
 - e) Renaissance humanism and a de-emphasis on religion while emphasizing secularism were impacting the situation as well
- 2. Moral corruption in the church was a major factor in the Reformation
 - a) simony = church offices bought and sold
 - b) many received salaries for which they did not work
 - c) some held several such "positions"
 - d) indulgences = selling to people the church's forgiveness of their and loved ones' sins
 - e) nepotism = favouring family members for prestigious and lucrative positions
 - f) sexual immorality of popes and clergy
 - a number of popes kept mistresses and had children out of wedlock
 - many priests openly kept concubines
 - g) many priests were virtually illiterate so the abuse of their power was rampant

- 3. The goals of the Reformers can be summarized as the "FIVE SOLAS", their five great foundational rallying cries:
 - a) **SOLA SCRIPTURA** (Scripture alone)
 - ◆ The Catholic Church taught
 - the foundation for faith and practice is a combination of
 - i) the Scriptures
 - ii) sacred tradition
 - iii) teachings of the pope and bishops
 - The Reformers said
 - our foundation is Scripture alone
 - b) **SOLA GRATIA** (Grace alone)
 - ◆ The Catholic Church taught
 - salvation is through a combination of
 - i) God's grace
 - ii) merits by penance & good works
 - iii) superfluous merits of others
 - The Reformers said
 - salvation is by God's grace alone
 - c) **SOLA FIDE** (Faith alone)
 - The Catholic Church taught
 - justification is by a combination of
 - i) faith
 - ii) works that we produce
 - The Reformers said
 - justification is by faith alone

d) **SOLUS CHRISTUS** (Christ alone)

- ◆ The Catholic Church taught
 - we are saved by the merits of Christ and the saints
 - we approach God through all those who pray and intercede for us
 - i) Christ
 - ii) the saints
 - iii) Mary
- The Reformers said
 - we are saved by Christ alone
 - we come to God through Christ alone
- e) SOLI DEO GLORIA (Glory to God alone)
 - † The Catholic Church taught
 - glory for a sinner's salvation can be attributed partly to
 - i) Christ
 - ii) Mary and the saints
 - iii) the sinner himself
 - The Reformers said
 - the only true gospel is the one that gives all the glory to God alone
- 4. One of the less favourable outcomes of the Reformation was the huge number of Protestant denominations that only seems to grow as the years pass
