- 1. Everything God does, everything He has created, is so that His glory may be seen
  - #3519 Tizz kabowd
    - = glory, honour, splendour, reverence

## #1391 δόξα doxa

- = the correct estimate concerning one
- = the quality of splendid, remarkable appearance
- → the glory of God is the manifestation of the infinite beauty and greatness of His manifold perfections
   John Piper
- → the glory of God is the external demonstration of internal quality
- → the glory of God is the shining forth of who He is – Jesus is the radiance of His glory
  - a) the heavens are telling of His glory
  - b) the whole earth is full of His glory
  - c) He created Israel for His glory
  - d) He chose the church for the glory of His grace, shown most powerfully in the death of Jesus Christ on the cross

(Isa 48:9-11; Isa 43:5-7; Heb 1:1-3a; Ps 19:1; Isa 6:3; Pro 16:4; Ro 9:22-23, 11:36; Eph 1: 4-8a)

- 2. We, the church, uniquely glorify God because →we have seen the light of the gospel and of
  - →we have seen the light of the gospel and of the knowledge of the glory of Christ
  - → we have experienced His grace in salvation
    (2 Cor 4:3-6)

- 3. We, together & individually glorify God in our
  - a) appreciation and enjoyment of Him
    - → He is set highest in our thoughts & lives
  - b) adoration or worship of Him
    - → as He has prescribed & as He deserves
  - c) affection and deep love for Him
    - → we set our hearts on Him, our treasure
  - d) subjection to Him
    - → we are dedicated to serve & obey Him (Ps 92:8; 97:9; 29:2; Deut 6:5)
- 4. The church most powerfully glorifies God as it preaches, teaches and lives SALVATION (:6)
  - → GOD to the praise of the glory of His grace which He freely lavished upon us
    - blessed us with all spiritual blessings
    - chose us before He created the world
    - predestined us to adoption as sons
    - made the mystery of His will known to us

## in / through JESUS CHRIST

- → in Him we have
  - redemption through His blood
  - forgiveness of our trespasses
  - obtained an inheritance
  - been sealed with the <u>HOLY SPIRIT</u> of promise

THAT <u>WE</u> WOULD BE TO THE PRAISE OF HIS GLORY

 The church glorifies God as it produces mature Christians → FILLED UP WITH GOD

#4137 πληρόω pleroo (v) #4138 πλήρωμα pleroma (n)

- a total quantity, with emphasis upon completeness
- = full measure, totality
- a) Paul prays that the believers may be filled up to all the fullness of GOD
  - that they may comprehend and know the love of Christ, which surpasses knowledge
  - as the church loves God is glorified
- b) the believers are equipped, taught and built up and they grow into a maturity that is the fullness of <u>CHRIST</u>
  - God is glorified
- c) the believers are commanded to be filled with the **HOLY SPIRIT** 
  - as they worship, give thanks and submit to each other in the body God is glorified
