Church Rites: BAPTISM Pt 2

- 1. When the church baptizes a believer it is to proclaim and demonstrate visibly that he has been changed, made a <u>new creature</u>
 - **#2937 κτίσις** *ktisis*
 - = a creation, a thing made or established

#2537 καινός *kainos*

- = new, recent, fresh
- = of a new kind, unprecedented, previously unknown, unheard of

(2 Cor 5:17, 21)

→ CHRIST

- 2. This baptism into Christ effecting a real change is clearly illustrated in an ancient pickling recipe (see images PDF)
 - → the born again one has been spiritually baptized = "baptizo" in the Holy Spirit
 - he has been immersed into
 - he has been united with

- he has been identified with

- → the change that has taken place is
 - permanent
 - irreversible



A "<u>cucumber</u>" has become a "<u>pickle</u>"!

- 3. Water baptism is not necessary for salvation
 - some passages do at first glance seem to require it in order to be saved
 - however the Bible does not teach this
 - all that is required for salvation is true faith
 - the Scripture makes clear that baptism with the Holy Spirit is salvation
 - water baptism is simply its sign
 - the thief on the cross was clearly saved although not baptized

(Mk 16:16; Acts 2:38; 16:30-31; Gal 6:15; 1 Cor 1:14-17; Lk 23:42-43)

- 4. It is however vital for the church to batize
 - it is commanded by Jesus and the apostles
 - it is a "re-enactment" of Holy Spirit baptism
 - it illustrates dramatically the believer's death, burial and resurrection with Jesus
 - it can be a believer's first opportunity to be a witness to the world (seen and unseen) of the forgiveness of his sins and the newness of his life
- 5. Baptism does not have to be carried out by an official (pastor or elder) of the church
 - the Bible does not expresslly address this
 - but if the great commission is given to all
 Christians then all Christians have the
 authority to baptize (Mt 28:19-20)

- 6. Because baptism is to be a sign and demonstration of salvation
 - ONLY people who have been born again should be baptized
 - since infants cannot believe or repent they should not be baptized
- 7. The church should aim to baptize people
 - as soon as possible after their salvation
 - as soon as possible after they become aware that baptism has been commanded (Acts 8:12, 35-38; 9:17-19; 10:47-48; 16:14-15, 30-33; 18:8)
- 8. Anyone baptized before salvation would have to be re-baptized upon believing
- 9. Because of the meaning of the word "baptism", immersion is the most logical way to baptize
 - baptism by sprinkling or pouring would be an oxymoron, something self-contradictory



Water baptism is one of the ways the church regularly preaches and teaches the gospel of salvation by grace through faith in Jesus Christ
