## **REPENTANCE**

#### **Definitions:**

## **HEBREW**:

- 1) 7725 🚉 🖽 shuwv
  - = to return, to turn (Jer 5:3, 8:6; Eze 18:32)
- 2) 5162 The nacham (108x; repent 41x)
  = to be sorry, regret, to rue, to suffer grief
  (Exo 13:17: lob 42:6)

#### **GREEK**:

## **3340 μετανοέω** metanoeo

- = to change one's mind, to change direction with an abhorrence of past sins
- = a change of mind regarding Jesus Christ
- 1. "Repent" was the defining call in the preaching of John the Baptist, Jesus and His disciples

  (Mt 3:1-2, 4:17; Mk 6:12; Acts 2:38)
- 2. Jesus' final challenge to the apostles was to preach repentance and forgiveness to all nations (Lk 24:46-47)
- 3. Repentance toward God and faith toward Jesus was Paul's testimony to Jew and Gentile alike (Acts 20:21, 26:20)
- 4. Repentance is the Lord's desire for all people (2 Peter 3:9)
- 5. "Repent" is God's command to all people everywhere (Acts 17:30)

- 6. Repentance is the only way to escape perishing (Lk 13:3.5)
- 7. True repentance is given by the risen Messiah

  Jesus, Prince and Saviour (Acts 5:30-31)
- 8. True repentance resulting in life is given by God, as a result of His kindness, patience and forbearance (Acts 11:18; Rom 2:4; 2 Pet 3:9)
  - a) through the preaching of the Word (gospel)
  - b) when God's Word is believed
    (Mt 12:41; Jonah 3:5-8)
  - c) correction, though painful, can result in godly sorrow & repentance (2 Tim 2:24-25; 2 Cor 7:8-11)
  - d) seeing and experiencing God as He really is brings about repentance (Job 42:5-6)
- 9. True repentance results in:
  - a) pardon, remission (blotting out) of sins (Isa 55:7; Lk 24:46-47; Acts 3:19)
  - b) receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit
  - c) great rejoicing in heaven, in the presence of the angels of God (Lk 15:7, 10)

(Acts 2:38)

- 10. True repentance is identified by:
  - a) a new attitude toward sin
    - sorrow over sin
    - shame because of sin
    - hatred of sin
    - self-loathing because of sin

(Lk 10:13; Joel 2:12-13; Jer 31:19; Lk 18:13)

- b) confession of sin and asking God for mercy
  (Hos 14:1-2; Lk 18:13-14)
- c) turning away from all
  - evil ways, transgressions and sins
  - idols and detestable practices
  - evil thoughts

(Eze 18:30, 14:6; Isa 55:6-7)

- d) turning to God to trust and serve only Him
  (1 Th 1:8-10; 1 Sa 7:3)
- e) fruit and deeds appropriate to in keeping with - repentance (Mt 3:8; Acts 26:20; Lk 3:8)
- f) baptism (Mk 1:4; Acts 2:38)
